Description:

One believes to see some kinds of tree trunks whose soul would have been freed on a part of the length, in a clear reference to Giuseppe Penone. These «trunks» are arranged on several planes, each appearing with great sharpness as betraying the depth of the field, and subtly lying the expected optical effect. In reality, they are peeled and partially «sculpted» carrots, photographed by means of a superposition of successive shots focused on different planes of depth. This long shooting exercise leads a fight over time that makes the vegetable too blent to retain its original shape. This is a work of a rather rare formal intelligence, both a commentary on the work of the artist, a commentary on the evanescence of forms, and on the metamorphosis always possible of the eminently futile ? a cut carrot ? as an object of contemplation and perhaps meditation.
